Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences Islamabad is a premier teaching and referral hospital of tertiary care level in the capital city of Islamabad, Pakistan, affiliated with Quaid-e-Azam Postgraduate Medical College, Quaid-e-Azam University Islamabad, College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan and Royal Colleges of UK. It is 1000 bedded hospital with postgraduate medical and nursing school and College of Medical Technology. It provides a wide range of specialist cover for a population of more than five million in addition to referrals from adjoining districts and the state of Azad Jammu & Kashmir. My unit usually attends 100-150 patients a day, twice a week out-patient clinic, 25-30 emergencies a day while on emergency duty twice a week on alternate weekends. 25-40 patients are usually admitted in Inpatient Department at a time while some are in Intensive care Unit. We usually operate 10-15 patients on an average list twice weekly including some very advanced surgical procedures like Whipple's procedure, Esophageal Resections and Transpositions, Gastrectomies and Thoracotomies etc. Earlier I worked in this Institute as Postgraduate Trainee for three years and later as Senior Registrar for three years and later I grew through senior registrar, assistant professor, associate Professor and currently I am working as Professor of Surgery. These posts have provided me wide experience in all aspects of acute and elective surgery. These positions offered good experience in complex Colorectal, Laparoscopic, Endocrine, Vascular, Breast surgery and ICU management. On an average day, cases of thyroid, hernia, breast and hepatobiliary can be

seen in our in patient department while cases of thoracic and vascular surgery are seen less frequently. I am actively involved in teaching of postgraduate residents/students, registrars, medical officers and house surgeons. These posts of my residents are recognized for higher surgical training by the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of UK and Ireland, and College of Physicians and Surgeons Pakistan. I had been involved in the management of mass disasters like bomb blast injuries and major road traffic accidents. Cases managed at PIMS are the most complex procedures because it serves as national referral centre. We manage complex malignancies, complex facial defects, fistulae and postoperative complications arising in patients operated in in other hospitals. I have operated and supervised surgeries in thousands. More than half of our admitted patients are acutely ill providing an opportunity to manage and learn lessons in critical care surgery. It provides a constant challenge to intellect and physical capacity leading to having stamina of a surgeon with a stone bladder and iron stomach while having a lion's heart and lady's fingers.

Hepatobiliary Surgery Unit was set up as a part of the Department of General Surgery in year 2007. My senior colleague was sent to the Kings College Hospital London and I was sent to the Royal Free Hospital London to have some exposure to the hepatobiliary surgery. Later at PIMS we established Hepatobiliary Surgery Unit. I have a special interest in hepatobiliary surgery. I am actively involved in the development of hepatobiliary surgery department at PIMS. I have performed countless major liver resections, segmental resections, biliary reconstructions, pancreaticojejunostomies, pancreaticoduodenal resections, portosystemic shunts, choledochal cyst and hydatid cyst resections, pancreatic necrosectomies and surgeries for complex HPB Trauma. In view of above, I can perform almost all hepatobiliary procedures like pancreaticoduodenectomy (Whipple's Procedure), Hepatectomy, Segmental resections of liver, shunt surgery for Portal hypertension where indicated, hepaticojejunostomies and cholecystectomies, obviously both open and laparoscopically. I have published and presented data of successful management of Complex HPB cases (trauma, malignancies and congenital problems) at national conferences and medical journals. I have been member of transplant team and successfully performed twenty five living donor kidney transplants at PIMS. Currently i am doing my Masters in Health Professions Education in send year.
